Feedback Report: Carlson Reserve Multi-Sport Courts

PROJECT BACKGROUND

Carlson Reserve on Clayton Road has a sports field on the eastern half of the reserve and the western part of the reserve is an 'active recreation' area with two tennis courts, a playground, a community and an open space referred as the 'forecourt'.

The public tennis courts are in poor condition and have reached their end of life. This project, 'Carlson Reserve Multi-Sport Courts', will be a major improvement and a key active recreation hub for Clayton. The new courts will be used for tennis, netball, basketball and futsal.

The <u>2018 Monash Open Space Strategy</u> highlighted the lack of open space in Clayton. 'Clayton is a priority precinct to undertake improvements or additions of open space provision'. The Clayton area has less than 0.6 hectares per 1000 people. Carlson Reserve also borders a 'Special Use Zone' comprising industrial and employment land to the north-east of the reserve.

The recommendation for improved open space was further strengthened in the <u>Monash Active</u> <u>Recreation Opportunity Strategy (2021)</u> where Carlson Reserve was listed as one of seven 'priority one', 'key active recreation sites' recommended for development.

Council sought ideas and feedback from the local community for a new multi-sports court at **Carlson Reserve, Clayton**.

A concept plan was prepared for community consultation. Construction of the site to be undertaken in 2022-23.

Carlson Reserve Redevelopment has been broken into three stages.

Stage 1

Stage one is the construction of a Neighbourhood Standard playground in 2021-22 at Carlson Reserve, Clayton.

Stage 2

Stage two is revitalising the land freed up by the demolition of the old scout hall as a landscaped forecourt area which will provide additional family social recreation opportunities.

Stage 3

Stage three is to upgrade the existing two public tennis courts to multi-purpose courts and associated sports lighting which is approaching the end of its useful life.

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the engagement is to consult with Councillors and local residents to seek their level of support and feedback for the proposed concept plan for Carlson Reserve Multi-Sport Courts.

- Inform Councillors and the community of the concept design that has been prepared for the site via Shape Monash website
- Promote engagement opportunities to provide feedback on the concept design during 8
 December 21 December 2021 via Information update/flyer to Councillors and local residents within 400 metre radius of the reserve via an information update flyer distributed on 8
 December 2021, and online survey.

There were 5 respondents to the survey. Of those that told us their gender, 20% were women or girls and 80% were men or boys.

Out of those 5 surveys, 2 respondents provided their feedback via email and 3 via the online survey on Shape Monash.

One respondent suggested to add a separate half basketball court with a hoop so as not to impede the high frequency use of people playing tennis on most days and evenings. The other resident reinforced the construction of a hit up wall for tennis as well as the inclusion of a basketball court.

A concept plan for the multi-sport courts was presented by flyer and on the Shape Monash website.

The survey asked 3 questions about the Carlson Reserve Multi-Sport Courts concept plan:

- As a local resident, how would you interact with this new facility?
- What design features are you most likely to use or enjoy?
- What design features would you like to see that are not on the concept plan?
