

Feedback Report: Orchard Street Playground

PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Playground Redevelopment Program 2020-2025 outlines the playground priorities for the redevelopment of existing playgrounds during this five-year period (2020-2025) to meet the needs and where possible, the expectations of families in Monash and in accordance with the proposed scale outlined in the Monash's Playground & Playspaces Strategy (adopted February 2020).

The prioritisation of priorities is based on advice from the most recent independent safety and condition audit for all 136 Monash playgrounds.

These renewed and upgraded playgrounds will meet the current and future needs of the community and deliver on Council's commitment to deliver flexible, sustainable, accessible, and quality community playground facilities.

Council sought ideas and feedback from the local community for a new playground at Orchard Street, Glen Waverley on Thursday 20, July 2023.

A concept plan will be prepared, and a second community consultation will occur with the report to follow. Construction of the site to be undertaken in 2024-25.

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the playground engagement is to consult with Councillors and local residents to seek their level of support and feedback for the proposed concept plan for Orchard Street playground.




SUMMARY OF HAVE YOUR SAY ENGAGEMENT





There is a lot of utilized space at this playground. We can make this area a much bigger play space for children with lots of different variety of play
items. There is another park opposite the playground, so there is no need to empty space dedicated for playing ball games etc. I would really like to see a big zip-line, as a feature attraction to this playground. As a frequent visitor of this park our family would love to see upgraded slides built in with some climbing area up to the slide itself, also the swing set should be upgraded, seating, retain seesaw possibly upgrade, more greenery and pathways Contribution 12 of 18 8 July 2023
I think the current reserve is underused because the few facilities only catering to toddler age group alone is grossly inadequate. There should be more facilities for the slightly older children as well as adults, particularly the seniors who usually supervise the children. My suggestion for the reserve is as follows: 1. The play area to be moved/ expanded westward towards the bike path and more playground equipment intalled. 2. The expanded play area to have rubber surfacing rather than the current bark chip surface. Rubber surfaces are more hygienic, requires lower maintenance and safer as foreign matters such as broken glass are easier to be noticed and removed. 3. While the play area should have equipment for children such as climbing frames, slides etc., there should be exercise equipment for senior adult. It will encourage seniors in our street to come out to do their exercise and socialize. Those equipment could be either in the currently grassed area on the eastern aspect of the reserve or placed along various points along a rubber surfaced walking path built around the perimeter of the reserve. 4. An exercise area with rubber surface and roof for shades to be created in the grassed area at the northern aspect of the reserve between the trees. I had seen people doing Tai Qi exercise there. 5. Park benches should be installed at various locations for people to sit while accompanying young kids or simply rest after exercise. Currently there is no seating. Providing seating will encourage people to use the reserve more. 6. A drinking fountain to provide clean water. 7. Currently part of the reserve is fenced off with cyclone fence. They are aged and ugly and only go part of the perimeter of the reserve. In the renewed reserve, they should be removed and replaced by fencing of contemporary design around the whole perimeter with user access point from Orchard Street as well as access for maintenance vehicles. This provides a safer space for the users. I believe this can rejuvenate the reserve, draw out the

left in poor condition. It needs to have far better ground cover than pine bark underfoot for children to play on. It requires better seating for parents,
not just one seat away from the playground, which I would not want to sit on due to its poor standard and "grottiness" and lack of upkeep. This
playground NEEDS to be accessible for children with disabilities! In this day and age this is a necessity. It needs to be colourful and inviting for parents
and children and the pathway access from Cherry Street needs improvement for wheelchairs, mobility equipment and prams/pushers. Another rubbish
bin would be advisable. As the Monash council has allowed older/original properties to be bulldozed for new residential properties where 2 and 3 units
are built on them, family growth has increased and there is no land for children to play around their own home. These playgrounds are now of great
