

Feedback Report: Westbrook Street Playground

PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Playground Redevelopment Program 2020-2025 outlines the playground priorities for the redevelopment of existing playgrounds during this five-year period (2020-2025) to meet the needs and where possible, the expectations of families in Monash and in accordance with the proposed scale outlined in the Monash's Playground & Playspaces Strategy (adopted February 2020).

The prioritisation of priorities is based on advice from the most recent independent safety and condition audit for all 136 Monash playgrounds.

These renewed and upgraded playgrounds will meet the current and future needs of the community and deliver on Council's commitment to deliver flexible, sustainable, accessible, and quality community playground facilities.

A concept plan will be prepared, and a second community consultation will occur with the report to follow. Construction of the site to be undertaken in 2024-25

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the playground engagement is to consult with Councillors and residents to seek their level of support and feedback for the proposed concept plan for Westbrook Street playground.

SUMMARY OF HAVE YOUR SAY ENGAGEMENT


There were 25 respondents to the online survey. Of those that told us their gender 52% were women or girls and 32% were men or boys and 16% preferred not to say. Respondents were asked to list their age group, from those who completed this data, 36% were adults, 12% were pre-school or younger, 40% were primary school age and 12% were secondary school aged.
