Consultation Report

Overview of Consultation

The community consultation and engagement program for the Monash Playground & Playspace Strategy Refresh ran from 25 May 2023 to 27 August 2023.

During the consultation period, there were 83 contributors to the Shape Monash page, 8 written and 12 MYzone middle year participant submissions/drawings received.

Summary of Engagement Methodology

- Shape Monash on-line consultation 83 contributors via <u>Playground Strategy Refresh | Shape Monash</u>
- 2. Direct Email to existing community networks including Monash sporting clubs, neighbourhood houses, playgroups and advisory committee members were directly emailed and encouraged to complete the on-line survey.
- 3. Project page subscription registration for regular project updates.
- 4. Monash Bulletin July 2023 & August 2023 articles in the Monash Bulletin distributed to every household in Monash translated into Chinese, Greek and Italian (refer pages 3 & 4)
- 5. Written Submissions 7 written submissions received via Shape Monash and 1 written submission via Facebook (total of 8 written submissions).
- 6. MYzone Middle Years Group drawings and/or written feedback from 12 MYzone participants (Monash Youth Services) on their 'perfect playground.'
- 7. Youth Services Program Participants distributed information to parents and other younger participants at youth services programs.
- Social Media post on 23 August 2023 1418 accounts reached, 147 engagements from people who liked, commented, shared, clicked through to our Facebook page or just opened the photo for a more detailed look. Refer page 5 or link to Facebook post at:

playspace wins State award

Notting Hill's Westerfield Drive Sensory Playspace has taken top honours at the Parks and Leisure Australia 2023 Regional Awards of Excellence (Vic/Tas), winning the Playspace Award for playspaces under \$500,000.

Upgraded in 2022, with support from the Victorian Government, this unique, inclusive playspace features innovative play elements – such as an 8-key Marimba, sound bouncers and sensory trails – designed to help children develop their sensory skills. As part of the development, Council worked with Notting Hill Neighbourhood House to free up 500m² of public open space to increase the size of the playspace.

The upgrade to Westerfield Drive Playspace was identified as part of the Monash Playground and Playspace Strategy 2020. We're currently refreshing this strategy, to develop a 10-year playspace upgrade program commencing 2025/26, and want to hear your feedback.

- 3. Clayton Community Centre has rich indoor children's services such as Maternal Child Health (MCH) services, Public Library services, playgroups, kindergarten, and Link Health and Community. However, there is not a single children's facility outside Clayton Community Centre. After attending children services in CCC building complex, children have nowhere to go and spend time outside the building complex, i.e. Indoor service rich and outdoor service poor.
- 4. Other community centres all have children's playgrounds attached to the building complex, with examples include:
- (1) Noble Park Community Centre has a superb playgrounds attached to it.

(4) The recently opened Monash Pinewood Child and Family Hub has a brand new playground built next to the Hub. https://www.monash.vic.gov.au/Community/Children-Family/Pinewood-Child-and-Family-Hub

In contrast, there is no playground facility at Clayton Community Centre premise. It is obvious that there is COMMUNITY FACILITY SERVICE GAP in Clayton CBD because outdoor children's services are lacking in this area in Clayton.

The gym site outside CCC hasn't been actively in use probably since it was built 20+ years ago. The playgroup coordinator has been working at Clayton Community Centre every week for more than 13 years. I have hardly seen people using this outdoor gym. It is fair to say that this community space is under-utilized. Please refer to the attached gym site photos.



The costs of converting the gym site into a playground is minimum by just adding a swing and slide to the site. The existing fence can be kept as it is. A self-lock door needs to be installed to ensure children's safety at the site. Clayton Community Centre is a key community congregation point located in a busy Clayton CBD precinct. Every inch of space needs to be fully utilized but not under-utilized or even unused. Converting this under-used outdoor gym into a popular children's playground will be a game changer transforming a real hot spot for children and families and it will further improve the popularity of Clayton Community Centre services.

Expected Outcomes

- Outdoor playground will provide opportunities for children to spend time immersed in nature for fresh air and sun which help with their body (eye, bone and lung) development, and many more benefits.
- Bring children and families together at CCC as informal social gathering.
- Meeting with other children and adults for social and mental wellbeing.
- Better outcomes for community engagement.
- Benefit all communities in City of Monash and beyond.



More families will join Active Monash services. CCC will become a more popular child-friendly community centre facility featured with future perspective.


















