

Feedback Summary Report: Mulgrave Reserve Playground

PROJECT BACKGROUND

This Feedback Summary Report has been compiled following the conclusion of two stages of community engagement for the Mulgrave Reserve Playspace Upgrade.

Mulgrave Reserve is an important sporting, passive recreation and environmental space for the residents of Wheelers Hill, and the broader Monash community.

The reserve is situated along the Dandenong Creek Trail and boasts two large sporting ovals, a new multi-sport pavilion, walking trail, wetlands, an off-leash dog area, and a playspace.

As part of the Mulgrave Reserve Masterplan, which was endorsed in 2018, Council is transforming the existing local-level playspace to a district-level playspace.

District playspaces are large and individually designed playgrounds, servicing a radius area of 2.5kms, and have a full range of supporting amenities, catering for all abilities. This includes things like toilets, drinking fountains, shelter, seating, barbecues, bins, off-street parking, tables, seats etc.

Construction of the new playspace is scheduled to take place in the 2024-25 financial year.

ENGAGEMENT APPROACH

Stage 1 of consultation, seeking ideas and feedback from the local community for the new playground at Mulgrave Reserve, took place from 16 June – 23 July 2023.

A draft concept plan incorporating the community's ideas was then developed, with Stage 2 of consultation taking place from 30 October – 24 November 2023.

The community was informed of, and engaged with, about both stages of the consultation process in the following ways:

- Information flyers mailed to local residents within a 400-metre radius of the reserve
- Online surveys via Council's Shape Monash platforms
- Council's social media pages
- Onsite consultation sessions with Council staff held at Mulgrave Reserve
- Internal e-bulletin to Councillors




SUMMARY OF HAVE YOUR SAY ENGAGEMENT – STAGE 1

The largest representative age group was primary school aged children, followed by pre-school or younger.





STAGE 2 – SUMMARY OF DRAFT CONCEPT PLAN ENGAGEMENT


There were 39 respondents to the draft concept plan survey on the Shape Monash platform, and one attendee at the onsite consultation. The Shape Monash page saw 416 visitors over the engagement period.

Onsite consultation summary – Stage 2

Respondent	Onsite consultation summary
1.	The onsite consultation was attended by a couple who expressed concerns about inadequate inclusion of older groups in this reserve. The residents had also emailed the Mayor regarding this matter. Due to budget constraints, the proposed fitness apparatus is a simple version-timber columns and beams – unlike the well-equipped outdoor gym in other Active Fitness nodes.

Question 1 – How do you/your child feel about the draft concept plan for Mulgrave Reserve?

Majority of respondents (79.5%) either loved or liked the draft concept design and 20.5% of respondents were unsure. No respondents stated they did not like the draft concept plan.



Question 2 – Why do you feel that way?

34 of the 39 respondents responded to this question.

Many respondents were positive on the variety of the proposed features and play elements, with many expressing enthusiasm for the playspace’s capacity to engage children and teens, as well having inclusive play elements.

Respondents also noted the benefit a quality playspace in that location brings for regular users of the reserve’s sport facilities. Other positive comments regarding the playspace includes lots of nature play and other natural elements.

The responses also included feedback and queries on the design, which we have included in full in the appendix on page 23. Some common themes are addressed below.



Question 3 – What are your/your child’s favourite elements on the draft concept plan?

The three key favourite play elements from respondents are climbing equipment, play units and swings. Other favourites included shade structure, picnic area and seating, and accessible elements.

Question 4 – Is there anything about the draft concept plan you’d like to change or anything else you’d like to see included?

Many respondents had suggestions on what they’d like to see changed or added in the final concept design.



Question 6 – Do you have any further feedback on the draft concept plan?

We heard from some respondents on additional ideas for the concept plan.




Your age group

Your Gender


The largest representative gender of respondents was women and girls.
