

# Feedback Summary Report: Orchard Street Reserve Playground

#### **PROJECT BACKGROUND**

This Feedback Summary Report has been compiled following the conclusion of two stages of community engagement for the Orchard Street Reserve Playspace Upgrade.

Orchard Street Reserve is a spacious reserve that is home to two halls and a playground with slides, swings and a seesaw.

As part of the Monash Playground and Playspace Strategy 2020-2025, Council is upgrading the existing playspace at the reserve.

This site is considered a local playspace, which is catered for residents living within 500 metres. Local playspaces include 5 to 8 items of play equipment for younger age groups up to primary school age. Local playspaces are usually only used by residents from nearby streets who spend up to an hour per visit. Amenities are generally limited to bench seating and accessibility features.

Construction of the new playspace is scheduled to take place in the 2024-25 financial year.

#### **ENGAGEMENT APPROACH**

Stage 1 of consultation, seeking ideas and feedback from the local community for the new playground at Orchard Street Reserve, took place from 19 June – 23 July 2023.

A draft concept plan incorporating the community's ideas was then developed, with Stage 2 of consultation taking place from 14 November – 9 December 2023.

The community was informed of, and engaged with, about both stages of the consultation process in the following ways:

- Information flyers mailed to local residents within a 400-metre radius of the reserve
- Online surveys via Council's Shape Monash platforms
- Council's social media pages
- Onsite consultation session with Council staff held at the reserve
- Internal e-bulletin to Councillors




#### Who we heard from





### STAGE 2 – SUMMARY OF DRAFT CONCEPT ENGAGEMENT


There were 19 respondents to the draft concept plan survey on the Shape Monash platform, including two email responses. The Shape Monash page saw 30 visitors over the engagement period.

# Question 1 – How do you/your child feel about the draft concept plan for Orchard Street Reserve?

Majority of respondents (94 per cent) either loved or liked the draft concept design and only 6 per cent were unsure about the draft concept.

#### Question 2 – Why do you feel that way?

13 of the 17 respondents responded to this question.

Many respondents were positive on the variety of the proposed features and play elements, with many expressing enthusiasm for the playspace's capacity to engage children. Other positive comments regarding the playspace includes lots of nature play and other natural elements.

The responses also included feedback and queries on the design, which we have included in full in the appendix on page 20. Some common themes are addressed below.



#### Question 3 – What are your/your child's favourite elements on the draft concept plan?

The three key favourite play elements from respondents are the three-bay and nest swing, picnic table and seating and play unit with hanging rings, scaling wall and slides. Other favourites included the play unit with wall climber, abacus and slide and nature play area.

Many respondents had suggestions on what they'd like to see changed or added in the final concept design.


These responses have been categorised into the following themes and addressed below:

A basketball ring, trampoline, and flying fox type equipment are outside the scope of the project and are not within the budget allocated for this project.

Other facilities	"I would like the design to include more seats for adults and at least another picnic table so that at least two families can picnic at the park. I really would like some of the play equipment to cater for children up to the age of 10 years so that the park can be used by the whole family."  "The addition of a barbecue area to the picnic area would also see increased usage from other families of larger size, which often have multiple children and adults in a generational home."	Thanks for the comments, these have been considered in the final design.  A BBQ along with additional seating are outside the scope of the project and are not within the budget allocated for this project.  We have provided adequate space in the social area for the size of the park.





#### Your Gender





Those equipment could be either in the currently grassed area on the eastern aspect of the reserve or placed along various points along a rubber surfaced walking path built around the perimeter of the reserve. 4. An exercise area with rubber surface and roof for shades to be created in the grassed area at the northern aspect of the reserve between the trees. I had seen people doing Tai Qi exercise there. 5. Park benches should be installed at various locations for people to sit while accompanying young kids or simply rest after exercise. Currently there is no seating. Providing seating will encourage people to use the reserve more. 6. A drinking fountain to provide clean water. 7. Currently part of the reserve is fenced off with cyclone fence. They are aged and ugly and only go part of the perimeter of the reserve. In the renewed reserve, they should be removed and replaced by fencing of contemporary design around the whole perimeter with user access point from Orchard Street as well as access for maintenance vehicles. This provides a safer space for the users. This site gets especially boggy and wet underfoot, at all times of the year when we have wet weather, as it is an old creek bed. It needs to be well drained, which it is not at present. It needs to have far better ground cover than pine bark underfoot for children to play on. It requires better seating for parents, not just one seat away from the playground, which I would not want to sit on due to its poor standard and "grottiness" and lack of upkeep. This playground NEEDS to be accessible for children with disabilities! In this day and age this is a necessity. It needs to be colourful and inviting for parents and children and the pathway access from Cherry Street needs improvement for wheelchairs, mobility equipment and prams/pushers. Great improvement on current park (lived in area for 35 years). Would like to see more play equipment as the designated open space areas are
not used for ball games by younger age groups up to primary school age. People use the scout hall reserve (across the road) for ball games as the
area is totally clear of trees and much better suited for ball games.
Thank you for making these upgrades the children will really enjoy it.
Given this area is next to a primary school, there is a much higher concentration of children in the area. It would be great to use more of the park
space to have more playing facilities - additional to the current design.
It needs more shade
Please make the space similar to the valley reserve playgound.
The concept plan looks a bit crowded, if possible can we please rearrange the setup slightly more efficiently. If budget allows can we please
remove the trees in between the two spots marked 16 to allow a larger open lawn or move them to the edges of reserve. Picnic table is better
moved to the lawn on the right. Balance rocks and swale feel unnecessary. Also cantilevered gyro swing is better than the traditional nest swing.
Having 2 picnic tables and additional seating for parents and grandparents watching children play would also be important as there are often
multiple families using even the existing small playground.
Instead of the open lawn area for kick around space within the orchard Street reserve, could the large grass area across the road at the scout hall
have soccer / football goals installed?
I like it.
I think it was a really good idea to build a new playspace. This is a great idea because I used play when I was little like almost every day, but now
the equipment is too small and not as much fun - except the swings. Building a new playspace with a larger variety of equipment is more inviting
to children of all ages.
